- 1. May 27, Souris field trip we had three people in attendance. Thank You Peter Harms, for taking the time to lead this trip.
- 2. Gillis Quarry; Ordovician fossils, we had three people in attendance. Thank you, Ken Fumerton for taking the time to lead this trip
- 3. The Red River Floodway Selenite dig is scheduled for June 27th, but may be delayed by one week as I am still waiting government confirmation. Please be advised that the Government department, originally was called the Floodway Authority in 2017. This department has been absorbed into the Manitoba Waterways, Transportation and Infrastructure. Management and employee contacts have also changed over the past 5 years. Their turn around time is now three weeks plus. If I do not receive a response/confirmation within the next couple of days, the Floodway dig start may be delayed by one week. 
