A few important notes about field trips;

Some things happened that are of a concern to all members and field trip coordinators and need to be addressed!

Any member attending our field trips should advise the field trip leader or chairman of any health concerns that can put you at risk, out in the field. Do you have a hearing problem, asthma, and allergies, inexperienced, disorientation concerns? If you have a health condition we should know about, please let us know. Members will be advised if they are engaged in an unsafe act like leaving a group in the bush, with out advising the leader. If you get lost, and you have a hearing impairment you are a liability. Unsafe behavior will not be tolerated.

Not all field trips pose the same risks. Some field trips may not be suitable, for the younger children or elderly with health concerns. Field trip leaders will advise members, of the route to be traveled, rest stops and of any inherent dangers to be aware of, prior to any field trip commencing, We ask that participants curb their enthusiasm, and listen to the fieldtrip leader when he is giving direction and voicing safety concerns.

Prior to any field trip it is important to keep in touch. Cell phones work well in this case. Things can happen that are beyond our control, so please advise the leader of any last minute changes. The fieldtrip leader will advise participants if there are changes that can be dictated by the weather. This year two trips were cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances.

When traveling to any fieldtrip destination, we like to travel in a group, for safety reasons. If anyone is unsure of the directions they should advise the leader and travel near the front of the group. We can usually provide a map with a detailed route and scheduled stops, for bladder relief, gas or just an opportunity for slower travelers to catch up. Some of our members have large yellow "Rock Hound " stickers so they can be easily identified as part of our group. If that is not enough, we can try fluorescent tracking tape
